### **ART WITH MRS GOLDING**

As the year comes quickly to an end we are still working along busily in our art classes. Classes 1 and 4 are making visual responses to story books studying a new one each week. Some of the titles have included 'Pig the Pug', 'Odd Dog Out', 'Emily and the Big Bad Bunyip' and 'Marvin Wanted More'. Classes 2, 3, 4 and 5 have been able to enter the 2020 Challenge Community Services Art Competition. This year's theme is 'Out of This World'. Students have been either painting or creating a collage on a canvas board. The students have come up with some great ideas based around the theme and the entire group's entries are very impressive. Snowy Valleys School 's entries will be placed in the mail on Thursday, November 5. There is prize money to be won in each category. Milly Murphy's piece is pictured below of a wolf howling in front of a blood red moon. Also pictured is Jye Lake's 'Rocket Ships' and Molly Jackson's 'Space Selfie'. The mural class has been busy in the school yard despite the continued rainy days that have sometimes kept us inside. The mural is of Yindi, the school's therapy dog, which is well on its way to being finished. The mural group has also been painting a wooden sculpture in our indigenous plant

garden. This consists of nine large pine logs that have been cemented in an upright position in groups of three. They will be painted in earthy colours with representations of our Australian animals and simple pattern work to compete them.







### LIBRARY WITH MRS BRADSHAW

During Term 4 in library students have focused on a range of books related art and craft activities and media projects, which have broadened their knowledge and understanding of the topic of celebrations. Areas of focus have included Book Week, NAIDOC celebrations, and an Australian Defence Force focus, which has helped lead the students to the importance of Remembrance Day. Term 4 will end with some literary classics on Christmas celebrations. The book 'Why I Love Australia' by Bronwyn Bancroft, was read and presented to students by a local Indigenous elder, Aunty Sue Bulger. The book, which displayed the varied aspects of Australian landscapes, was enhanced by Aunty Sue's love of the Australian Country. Students then went on to paint various landscapes with Indigenous artistic techniques. In preparation for Remembrance Day this month, students have been preparing video questions for Petty Officer Jack Bowman-Pinnock, an officer with the Australian Navy, asking a variety of questions about the life and experiences of military life.

This week Tom chose the story of former USA president, Barack Obama, who made a three-point shot inside a Michigan gym on Saturday, as he campaigned for Joe Biden in the USA presidential race.
